

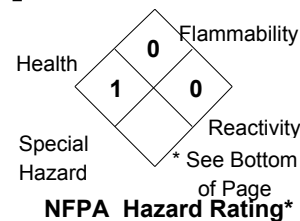

V. HEALTH HAZARD DATA
